Judging Criteria

LIST A(1)

1. For persons who have previously been approved by the Kennel Club to award CCs in the breed and have completed their first appointment. **(KC Policy)**
2. To have the support of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever Club.

LIST A(2)

1. For persons who fulfill all the requirements for the A3 list and who have been assessed in accordance with Kennel Club requirements and accepted by the Kennel Club for inclusion on an A2 list.
2. To have the support of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever Club. **(KC Policy)**
- 3 To have attended an open field trial or an open gundog test (GWT) in the relevant sub-group **(KC Policy)** and obtain a running order signed by test/trial or general secretary.

LIST A(3) BREED SPECIALISTS

- 1 Must have been actively engaged in the breed for at least 10 years as owner/exhibitor.
- 2 To have at least 7 years judging experience in the breed and to have the support of the club. **(KC Policy)**
- 2 To have judged at least 7 dogs in the breed at a Championship show without CCs.
- 3 To have judged the breed at Open shows or Championship shows without CCs with an adequate geographical spread.
- 4 To have judged a minimum of 30 dogs in the breed. **(KC Policy)**
- 5 To have attended seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited trainer, and passed the relevant examination on Requirements of a Show Judge (Rules & Regulations). **(KC Policy)**
- 6 To have attended seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited trainer on conformation and movement. **(KC Policy)**
- 7 To have attended a "points of the dog" Assessment conducted by a Kennel Club Accredited trainer and passed the assessment. **(KC Policy)**
- 8 To have attended at least one CBRC breed seminar & "Breed Certificate in Judging Competency" run in accordance with the KC Code of Best Practice and passed an examination or assessment and attained a certificate where relevant within the last 10 years. **(KC Policy)**
- 9 To have bred and/or owned an minimum of three dogs when they obtained their first entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book (save in exceptional circumstances). **(KC Policy)**

- 10 To have stewarded for a minimum of 12 shows. **(KC Policy)**
- 11 To have attended an open field trial or an open gundog test (GWT) in the relevant sub-group **(KC Policy)** and obtain a running order signed by test/trial or general secretary.

LIST A(3) NON-BREED SPECIALISTS

- 1 Must have been actively engaged in own breed for at least 7 years as owner/exhibitor.
- 2 To have at least 5 years judging experience in CBRs and have the support of the club. **(KC Policy)**
- 3 To have judged at least 7 dogs in the breed at a Championship Show without CCs.
- 4 To have judged the breed at Open Shows or Championship Shows with an adequate geographical spread. **(KC Policy)**
- 5 To have judged a minimum of 30 dogs in the breed. **(KC Policy)**
- 6 To have attended seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited trainer, and passed the relevant examination on Requirements of a Show Judge (Rules & Regulations). **(KC Policy)**
- 7 To have attended seminar given by a Kennel Club Accredited trainer on conformation and movement. **(KC Policy)**
- 8 To have attended a “points of the dog” Assessment conducted by a Kennel Club Accredited trainer and passed the assessment. **(KC Policy)**
- 9 To have attended at least one CBR breed seminar & “Breed Certificate in Judging Competency” run in accordance with KC Code of Practice and passed an examination or assessment and attained a certificate where relevant within the last 10 years. **(KC Policy)**
- 10 To have stewarded for a minimum of 12 shows. **(KC Policy)**
- 11 To have awarded CCs in at least one other breed. **(KC Policy)**
- 12 To have attended a Field Trial and have signed running order from the field trial sec or chief steward **(KC Policy)** and obtain a running order signed by test/trial or general secretary.
- 12 To have bred and/or owned a minimum of three dogs when they obtained their first entry in the Kennel Club Stud Book (save in exceptional circumstances).

LIST B – BREED SPECIALISTS

- 1 Must have been actively engaged in the breed for at least 7 years as owner/exhibitor and have the support of the Club.
- 2 To have judged a minimum of 15 CBRs spanning at least 3 years and three judging appointments.
- 3 To have stewarded at five Kennel Club licensed shows.
- 4 To have attended one CBR breed seminar run in accordance with KC Code of Best Practice and to have passed an examination or assessment and attained the relevant certificate within the last 10 years.
- 5 To have attended seminars on Conformation & Movement and Requirements of a Show Judge (Rules & Regulations) as required by the Kennel Club and to have attained the relevant certificates.

LIST B – NON-BREED SPECIALISTS

- 1 To be actively engaged in own breed or breeds for at least 10 years as owner/exhibitor.
- 2 To have 5 years' judging experience in gundog breeds and to have judged 15 CBRs spanning at least 3 years and three judging appointments.
- 3 To have stewarded at five Kennel Club licensed shows.
- 4 To have attended one CBR Breed seminar run in accordance with the KC Code of Best Practice and to have passed an examination or assessment and attained a certificate where relevant within the last 10 years.
- 5 To have attended seminars on Conformation & Movement and Requirements of a Show Judge (Rules & Regulations) as required by the Kennel Club and to have attained the relevant certificates.

LIST C – BREED SPECIALIST

- 1 For aspirant judges who have shown an interest in the Breed and have the support of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever Club.
- 2 To have attended one CBR Breed seminar run in accordance with KC Code of Best Practice.
- 3 To have stewarded at three Kennel Club licensed shows.
- 4 To have Attended "Stewarding Seminar" and attained a certificate.

LIST C – NON-BREED SPECIALISTS

- 1 For aspirant judges who have shown an interest in the Breed and have the support of the Chesapeake Bay Retriever Club.
- 2 To have attended one CBR Breed seminar run in accordance with KC Code of Best Practice.
- 3 To have stewarded at three Kennel Club licensed shows.
- 4 To have Attended "Stewarding Seminar" and attained a certificate.

CBRC criteria may be subject to annual amendments/additions as required by the Kennel Club.
